What do you think?

(解答例)

• I agree. Even though many students are interested in working as volunteers, they often do not know where to start. If schools advertised opportunities for students to work as volunteers, it would help them find work that they liked, and it would also be useful for their future careers. If volunteering opportunities were promoted and monitored by schools, students would feel confident about signing up. By contrast, relying on sources like social networking services for information about volunteering can be dangerous.

• I disagree. The main responsibility of schools is not to get their students to do volunteer work but to teach them academic subjects. Teachers are already too busy to take on extra work like helping students find volunteer work. It is up to students to do that themselves. There is plenty of information available on the Internet, so students do not need to rely on schools for information.

(別解例)

- I think schools should be involved. My main reason for saying so is that schools can check up on volunteer positions to make sure that they're safe. Students generally don't know much about the organizations which seek volunteer staff, so looking for positions by themselves can be dangerous. And I think schools should be aware of what their students are doing even outside of school. Schools should protect their students from any possible harm.
- I don't think schools need to be involved. Volunteering is an optional activity that students can do outside school hours, so they should try to find suitable positions on their own. And students know better than schools which volunteer activities best suit their personal interests and needs. For example, they can choose activities that take place close to where they live and match their schedules. Making it their own responsibility to find suitable volunteer work can help them to become more organized and responsible individuals.
